1 Mentioned in Sanskrit texts as *prâna* ("life" or "spirit of life"); burned as aromatic smoke in rituals.

- 2 Used in embalming mummies of nobility.
- 3 Recorded in historical texts for cultural practices.
- 4 Used in funerary practices and as perfume.
- 5 Dioscorides described oud as a plant-derived medicine in Materia Medica.
- 6 Imported on a large scale by Arab traders via India.
- 7 Still central to Emirati and Gulf culture; used in religious rituals and as bakhoor incense.
- 8 Incorporated into luxury perfumes by brands like Dior, YSL, Chanel, Tom Ford.
- 9 Still used in incense, traditional perfumes and spiritual rituals across cultures.
- 10 Common in weddings, celebrations, body oils, and home fragrances in Saudi Arabia and the Gulf
- 11 Oud has been used throughout history for spiritual, medicinal and cultural purposes.

 Today, it continues to serve similar roles, especially in rituals and celebrations but has also gained prominence as a luxury perfume ingredient. This continuity shows how oud's value as both fragrance and symbol has endured through centuries.
