Synthesis (4 minutes)

Which technological advancement in tilemaking had the greatest impact? Support your answer by comparing the different techniques.⁶

1 Timeline answer key: 1) 13th century: Tilemaking technique—alicatado; phrase describing the technique—clay tiles are painted and baked, then painstakingly cut into pieces and pressed into mortar; phrase describing the impact of the technique—pieces formed shapes such as spindles, petals and leaves; 2) 14th century: Tilemaking technique—Hispano-Moresque arista; phrase describing the technique—soft clay pressed into molds; phrase describing the impact of the technique—more efficient than mosaics; 3) 16th century: Tilemaking technique—Maiolica; phrase describing the technique—images painted directly on clay; phrase describing the impact of the technique—enabled faster, cheaper production; 4) 21st century: Tilemaking technique—Hispano-Moresque arista revival; phrase describing the technique—images painted directly on clay; Modern artisans replicate centuries-old Moorish methods to preserve traditional craftsmanship—keeps centuries-old Moorish traditional methods alive;

2 King Manuel I visited Seville and the Alhambra Palace, then ordered Moorish artisans to ship ceramic tiles from Spain to Portugal.

3 Tile imagery shifted from the abstract art of the Gothic era to more hyper-realistic depictions of flowers, vegetables, animals and people.

4 Tiles could be produced faster and cheaper, enabling mass production and allowing Portuguese tilemakers to collaborate with other manufacturers in Europe.

5 Miguel Moura doesn't want to work in a factory producing identical tiles. He values the connection to his ancestors and takes pride in keeping traditional methods alive.

6 Answers will vary, but students should compare the different techniques—such as alicatado, arista and maiolica—to explain which innovation most influenced the evolution of tilemaking.
