1 Answers may include: the Blue Mansion has indigo-colored walls; the courtyard contains carved wooden balconies; the mansion casts cool shadows across the tiled courtyard; visitors gather in the courtyard while listening to Lin Lee; the mansion once belonged to Cheong Fatt Tze.

2 Answers may include:

- George Town once thrived as a British free port and maritime crossroads.
- After independence in 1957, the city fell into decline.
- Historic buildings deteriorated or disappeared as modern construction replaced older neighborhoods.
- Conservation efforts later restored important sites like the Blue Mansion and Fort Cornwallis.
- George Town became a UNESCO World Heritage site in 2008.

3 Answers may include:

- George Town began as a British free port.
- It became a maritime crossroads connecting Malay, Chinese, Indian, Arab and European communities.
- Trade and migration shaped the city's economy, architecture and social divisions.
- Colonial rule influenced the construction and purpose of places like Cornwallis.
- Global trade and migration helped create the diverse cultural identity of George Town.

4 Answers may include:

- George Town began as a British free port.
- It became a maritime crossroads connecting Malay, Chinese, Indian, Arab and European communities.
- Trade and migration shaped the city's economy, architecture and social divisions.
- British colonial rule influenced sites like Fort Cornwallis and the city's development.

5 Answers may include:

- Fort Cornwallis includes stormwater retention to improve climate resilience.
- Restoration projects reconnect public spaces with civic and community life.
- The Blue Mansion functions as a hotel, cultural venue and educational space.
- Historic preservation supports tourism while also protecting cultural identity.
- Conservation projects show how older spaces can continue serving modern communities.
